New Downtown Milwaukie Development Project (Jennifer Dillan & Jesse ledesma) Dogwood Station (2206 SE Washington) Long-time resident of Milwaukie, recently purchased a home in Downtown Milwaukie across from Axel Tree apartments. They are very interested in building affordable housing in the house. House currently needs moderate repairs.

Consistent with high level goals of Milwaukie. 50-60 affordable workforce housing, 60-100% of median family income. \$54k to \$70k for single person. High quality living environment for the average worker.

Plan is to use Mass Timber construction – new fad, lots of exposed wood, very carbon neutral, and very aesthetically pleasing

6 stories, mix of 1 bedroom and 2 bedrooms with rooftop terrace and courtyard. Bottom floor is lobby, no commercial space. General design plan, not yet fixed.

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Parking is currently a major concern. Considering buying a lot elsewhere, providing max passes, bike storage, loading and unloading in front of building, zip cars at the building. But the lot is currently restrained on all sides and can't expand for parking.

- f. Land Use: Last week the hospital planning commission review for the senior affordable housing building. Continuance was requested because some of the neighbors had not received enough communication from development. No official NDA comments, but Lisa and Matt submitted comments about the 3 variances. The vote and discussion is at the next planning session on May 25<sup>th</sup>, no public discussion, just the planning commission. Expect it to be approved by the planning commission, and then they will submit to HUD on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Traffic impact study and landmarks review have not been submitted yet.

Monroe street apartment development has been scrapped, the developer walked away due to the high price of lumber and building materials.

32<sup>nd</sup> and Roswell – Walnut Subdivision: Has broken ground, 2 or 3 houses on 32<sup>nd</sup> street. More discission needed on the buildout of 33<sup>rd</sup> street before rest of plots can be developed.

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Plans were submitted for 32<sup>nd</sup> and Olsen street apartment building, they are still in discussion. No variances necessary, so only interest for neighborhood is to make sure the stormwater runoff and DEQ rehabilitation necessary

- i. <u>Portland Clean Air Update:</u> Will have grant request in June for bike monitors for air testing
