- Monthly Police Report
 - Staffing remains number one concern after some recent retirements. Progress being made:
 - Swore in recent recruits including a retired captain and lateral hire
 - Promoted Kenny Simac to Sergeant
 - Still actively hiring
 - Flora, new K9 electronic sniffing, off to a strong start with several busts in supporting electronics based crimes
 - o Open house with the police department last month was a success
 - Once a week the Police Department down at the library on Tuesdays to liase with those in needs
 - Program for offenders to check in with parole officers resulting in 50% reduction in overall probation arrests due to the success of the program
 - Reporting on the types of dispatch calls is available on the website
 - Enhancements to the user interface and platform coming down the line
 - Goal to drive more transparency with the public
 - Open questions
 - Question With the statistics can you see any trends?
 - Answers: Yes, seeing positive trends:
 - Burglary down, atypical for the summer
 - Downtrend in all types of emergencies calls over the summer
 - General comments
 - Public gratitude for the cops; no call no small guiding principle to make face to face contact
- Public Comments
 - Question What is happening in the vacant lot across from Milwaukie Bottle Café?
 - Answer Owner of the lot is resubmitting permits to build an apartment complex but not requesting any variances this time
 - Milwaukie Hubs program encourages more walkable business by

allowing more mixed-use construction in certain parts of the neighborhood

- JC Ardenwald has 3 hubs -
 - Milwaukie Bottle Café Shop Block
 - Van Waters Street (Ardenwood Historic Church) Area
 - Roswell Neighborhood Market Area
- Question, what is happening with the Hillside Development?
 - Subsidized affordable housing going in
 - Priority to the previous residents of the former units
 - All apartments no commercial in Phase 1
 - Update no longer going to have a road through to Harrison
 - Known traffic pattern changes?
 - TBD, but it is already a failing intersection which is a loop hole and doesn't require improvements to the intersection
 - Builders will be doing traffic pattern studies
 - More detail found on the Milwaukie City Website
- Question, what is happening with the Harvey Park Development
 - Tentatively finished next summer
 - More detail found on the Milwaukie City Website
 - Still open for comments on any of these public projects
- Street Painting Project
 - Proposal have a street mural to draw more attention to the street to highlight safety at cross street to 29th and Balfour
 - Question out to the city on if they plan to repave Balfour as part of the new park
 - Hold on decision to complete a mural project until we understand impacts of Balfour Park development on the street
- NDA Meeting Signs
 - Proposal to print 10 signs and post in the neighborhood in order to drive more traffic to monthly meetings and raise awareness about the NDA
 - Signs to be put out a week before each meeting and then collected
 - Lisa Gunion-Rinker made a motion to secure funding for signs up to \$100 (10 signs)
 - Travis-Holle-Bailey seconds the motion
 - Ayes have the vote and motion passes
 - Steve Smith to create a design, and Lisa will work with Rob (Made in Milwaukie) to get signs printed before the next meeting
- Concert Recap
 - Current balance ~9,000k after concert grants and profits from sales
 - Open question on what grants would be available for next year; biggest donors were New Season
 - Milwaukie Cultural Association
 - Not the same relationship with Providence
 - Celebrate Milwaukie for 1000k
 - Last summer concert series expenses were 4900k
 - Requests 5000k earmarked for next summer series up from the 3,000k the previous year
 - Lisa made a motion to earmark 5,000 for the annual concert series
 - Ayes have it, the motion passes
 - Planning for next year
 - Support needed to secure Grants, Advertising in the neighborhood, and Social Media marketing

- December: Solstice Vending Fundraising
 - Milwaukie Solstice Party every December on Milwaukie Bay Park to watch the Winter Ships come in (Ships decorated with lights and decorations)
 - Last year the JC Ardenwald NDA sold glowsticks and it was a big hit
 - Agenda item for October is to finalize the merchandising proposal to do glowsticks again at a minimum
 - Call for ideas up to 3 items bring them suggestions to the next meeting
- Winter Solstice Potluck Date tbd
- Portland District 4 Update
 - o JC Ardenwald Neighborhood is partially in Milwaukie and Portland
 - Portland is undergoing a large re-organization as a result the neighborhood districts within Portland are shifting
 - JC Ardenwald now falls under a new district coalition (District 4)
 - o Discussion: Do we want to remain a member of Portland's coalition?
 - Benefits
 - Grant funding from Portland
 - Fiscal Sponsorship However not guaranteed in the new coalition
 - SE Uplift, old non-profit, used to be the fiscal funder for non-profit
 - There will be a charge under the new district
 - Option to begin our own non-profit become a federally recognized 501c-3 to address the fiscal funding
 - A decade since the last time the NDA was a non-profit; but we have been in the past
 - Decision, remain part of the Portland District 4 Coalition and sign membership agreement for this year while we pursue to become a nonprofit
- Annual Work Plan
 - City of Milwaukie is encouraging NDAs to align their priorities and plans for the upcoming year
 - o Discussion: What are our goals? New event ideas?
 - Reground in our mission statement Protect land use and promote civic engagement
 - Identified Top priorities
 - New resident member engagement and awareness. Ideas include
 - Mailers to Portland side residents (currently low involvement from this group)
 - Membership drive targeted to new residents
 - Socials and events outside concerts
 - Spring Picnic and rotate to a different park
 - Participate in Balfour Park grand opening March 8th
 - Action Item: Lisa / Chris to check in with NCCPRD. They will join Oct meeting to provide an update on the park.
 - Neighborhood education to boost civic pride either as
 - stand-alone events or part of other events (e.g booth)
 Potential to partner with Historic Milwaukie
 - Museum
 - Continue existing successful programs
 - Summer Ardenwald Concert Series
